We are designing and building projects citywide that will enable the City of Los Angeles to:

- Assist in compliance with federal, state, and local water quality mandates
- Protect local rivers, creeks, lakes, and bays
- Create more green space
- Empower local communities

These goals are being accomplished through the Los Angeles County Safe Clean Water Program and the City of Los Angeles Sustainable City pLAN.

The project described in this fact sheet is one of the major projects funded by the Measure W Safe Clean Water Program to help bring these benefits to the City and the community.



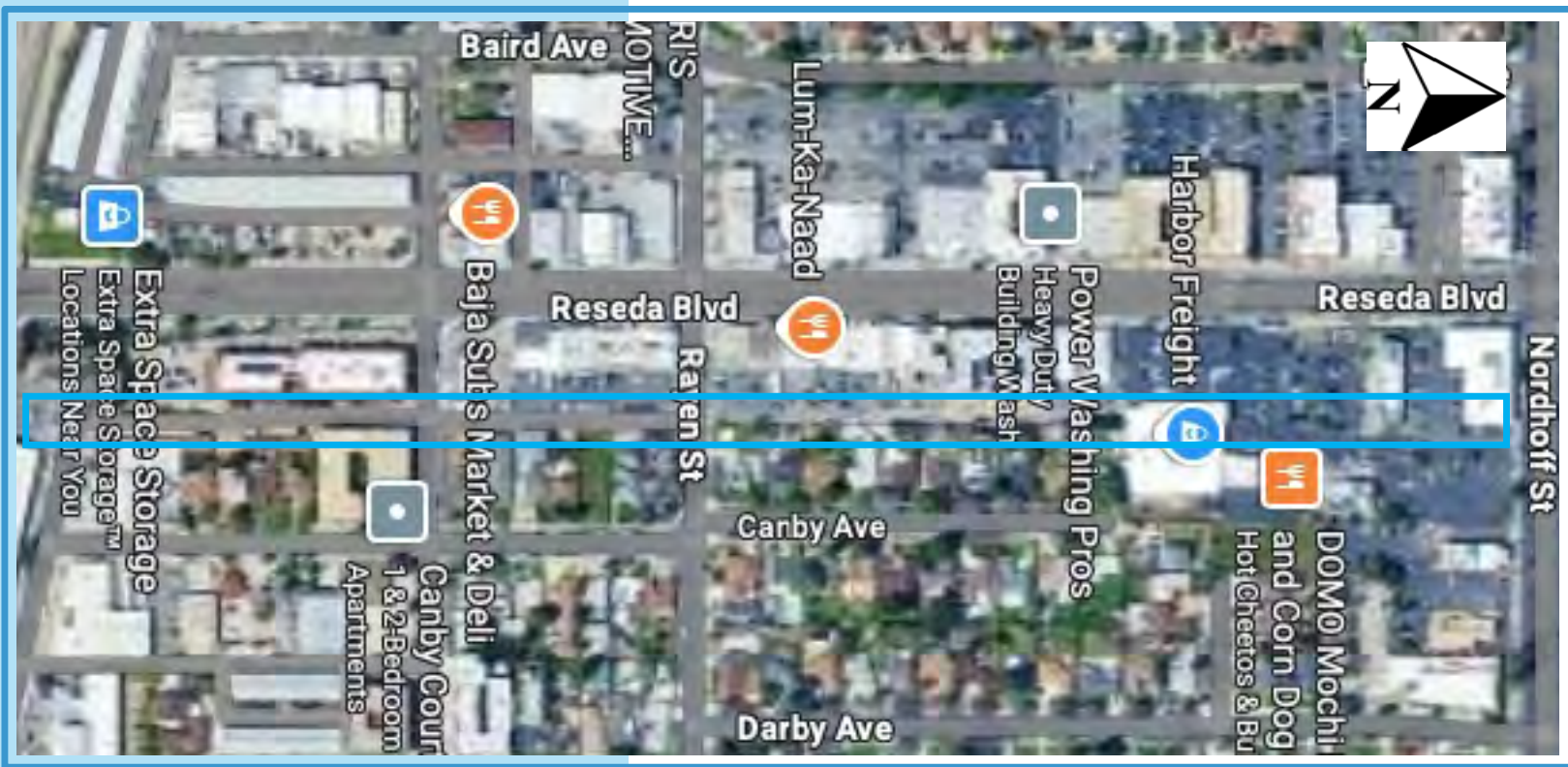
The Reseda Boulevard Alley Green Streets Project will transform a 1,750-foot alley (East of Reseda Boulevard, from approx. Nordhoff Street to Parthenia Place) into a multi-benefit corridor through the installation of drywells and permeable pavers, and planting of new parkway swales and trees.

Project Benefits:

- ✓ Increased water supply by capturing stormwater
- ✓ Improved environmental water quality
- ✓ Reduced "heat island" effect
- ✓ Community beautification through planting of new shrubs and trees*
