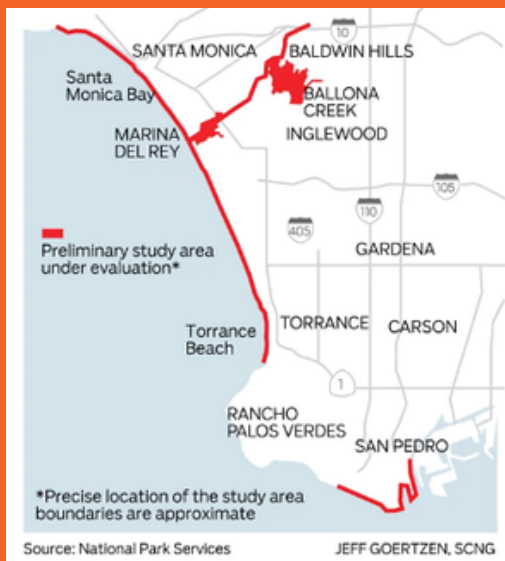

NATIONAL PARK POSSIBILITIES

The National Park Service is studying whether a large swath of the L.A. coastline (see red areas below) should become a national park.



The National Park Service (NPS) is conducting a "special resource study" to gather information about select sites along the Los Angeles coast through research and public input, and will then report these findings to Congress. The study will evaluate the potential for inclusion of the Los Angeles coast in the NPS system based upon whether it meets established criteria for significance, suitability, feasibility, and need. New NPS units are typically added by an Act of Congress
